Objective 5:	Students will be able to demonstrate essential interviewing, counseling, and case conceptualization skills.
Objective 6:	Students will be able to engage in all aspects of group counseling, including recruiting, screening, and selecting members.
Objective 7:	Students will be able to identify and use assessments for diagnostic and intervention planning purposes.
Objective 8:	Students will be able to articulate the importance of research in advancing the counseling profession, including how to critique research to inform counseling practice.
Objective 9:	Students will engage in professional development opportunities which directly contribute to their personal and professional growth.
Objective 10:	Students will be able to demonstrate and apply techniques and interventions for prevention and treatment of a broad range of mental health issues.
Objective 11:	Students will be able to critically examine the connections between social, familial, emotional, and behavior problems and academic achievement.
