


Accounting

The US Department of Labor states employment opportunities for accounting positions will **rise 7%** through 2028, adding about **135,000 new jobs**. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, in 2020 the median annual wage for accountants and auditors was **\$73,500**.

Globalization, a growing economy, and a complex tax and regulatory environment are expected to continue to lead to strong demand for accountants and auditors.
