Tip of the Month

File a complaint when buildings lack accessibility

You can file an ABA complaint if you have encountered or are aware of an accessibility barrier at a building or facility covered by the ABA. This includes federal buildings

If your concerns are about the accessibility of state or local government facilities, or places of public accommodation, like movie theaters and hotels, you can file a civil rights complaint with the US department of Justice using its Civil Rights Reporting Portal.
