ADMISSION CRITERIA

IN-STATE, OUT-OF-STATE AND HOME SCHOOLED STUDENTS must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Meet Regents' Core Curriculum (Core 4)
- 2. Earn 2.35 minimum high school GPA
- 3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English OR 19/500 or 25 in Math

Contact your recruiter to find out how you can be admissible.

OUT-OF-STATE AND HOME SCHOOLED STUDENTS can also be admitted by the following admission requirements:

- 1. Complete 17 of the 19 units of the Regents' Core Curriculum
- 2. Earn 2.35 minimum overall high school GPA
- 3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English OR 19/500 or 25 in Math
- 4. Earn a 2.0 minimum core GPA

<u>OR</u>

- 1. ACT composite score of 23 (SAT combined math and critical reading score of 1050)
- 2. Have a minimum overall high school GPA of 2.35
- 3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English OR 19/500 or 25 in Math








Northwestern State University
